#### SUMMARY OF ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF CITING/REFEREE'S REPORT/INCIDENT FOOTAGE

The Lethbridge Rugby Club Alleges that Mr. Wennekers contravened the referenced laws in the following ways: at 1:00:13 after the ball is played by LRC at the base of the Ruck, Canucks 23 tackles a Lethbridge Player high who is not in possession of the ball.

At this point Lethbridge 23 punches Canucks #23

At 1:00:18 both players exchange punches

After this it is alleged by Lethbridge #23 that Canucks #23 utters a racial slur (the N-word) at which point L23 charges him and both players exchange punches again.

#### **ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF OTHER EVIDENCE (e.g. medical reports)**

The video clearly shows the complete exchange between the players at or around to 1:00:00 mark of the match. The video shows the C23 entered a ruck at or about the time the ball leaves the ruck, he is engaged with LRC7 who then pulls him through the ruck and throws him to the ground. He is punched and retaliates with punches of his own.

#### **SUMMARY OF PLAYER'S EVIDENCE**

The player himself, and through his club representative state that at no time did he tackle anyone above the line of the shoulders, that he was properly in contact in a ruck with LRC7, and that LRC 7 threw him to the ground at which point he was the victim of a punch from L23, which he freely admits he retaliated in self-defence. It is C23 evidence that after incident one had defused, and he was approaching the Match Official in anticipation of being sent off L23 charged him and struck him in the head igniting the second melee. C23 vehemently denies that he used any racial slurs.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

World Rugby Regulation 17.16.4 holds that "In citing cases involving Matches in which no Citing Commissioner was appointed and team citing applies, the Disciplinary Committee or Judicial Officer must establish:

- (i) that the incident was undetected by the referee and/or assistant referees, and
- (ii) the alleged Foul Play was sufficiently serious to warrant an Ordering Off.

If the Disciplinary Committee or Judicial Officer does not consider the alleged Foul Play of sufficient seriousness to have warranted an Ordering Off they shall dismiss the citing complaint. If the Disciplinary Committee or Judicial Officer considers the alleged Foul Play of sufficient seriousness to have warranted an Ordering Off, the Disciplinary Committee or Judicial Officer shall move to the next stage of the hearing to determine the sanction (if any) to be imposed on the Player in accordance with Regulations 17.17 to 17.21.

I am not convinced on the balance, after review of the video footage, and taking into account all of the player statements that Mr. Wennekers high tackled anyone. I note that the contact occurred at the ruck, in plain view of the referee, I cannot conclude on the balance that the Match Official did not see that contact and as a result I cannot interfere with the match officials on field decision not to punish the matter on the field.

I am convinced on the balance, that as the ruck was breaking up Mr. Wennekers was brought to the ground by L7, and was subsequently struck in the head, without provocation and without warning by L23, and that he struck back in self-defense and retaliation, or a combination of the above. I am satisfied that the Referee could not have seen the first punch and the retaliation defense, as the ball had moved by this point, I am however not convinced that this would have met the "Red Card Test" however Mr. Wennekers may have seen a yellow card and as a result I cannot uphold the citing with respect to that incident.

Having regard to the allegation the C23 used the N-word which caused the second melee. I note from the video that the players were separated by at least 10 meters. I further note that the match official was between the players and that at least 25 players were in the immediate vicinity. Neither the Match Official, nor any other player reports hearing the N-word, I am convinced on the balance that had that actually occurred there would be significant, and visible outrage, such is absent from the video and I cannot uphold that claim.

This leads me to my final finding of fact. Mr. Wenneker's reaction to the second punch was not self-defense but was in fact retaliatory, it was in fact behind the view of the referee, and not detectable by the match official, however I am not convinced that when the recipient of an otherwise unprovoked attack that a match official would send the player off. I cannot uphold the citing under those circumstances.
