DISCIPLINE DIRECTOR

Term: 2 Years

The Discipline Directors main role is to represent the Calgary Rugby Union (CRU) in all matters dealing with discipline issues.

Roles and Responsibilities

- Sit on the disciplinary panel for the Alberta Womens Premier (AWP) and Alberta Cup (AC) divisions.
- Head the disciplinary committee for the Men's, Women's and youth divisions of rugby directly under the CRU's jurisdiction.
- All discipline issues with players on and off the field as well as coaches, referees and spectators.
- To attend monthly meetings with the CRU board.
- To advise the CRU board on any disciplinary issues.
- To review the Alberta Rugby rules and regulations in conjunction with the World Rugby Regulation 17 to apply the necessary sanctions for the disciplinary act that has occurred.
- To consult with Directors for Men's, Women's and Junior rugby on when club sanction will need to be applied.
- To write up a Discipline Director report to be read at the annual CRU AGM and to be entered in the minutes.
- To be well versed in the current Alberta Rugby Rules and Regulations as well as World Rugby's Regulation 17 (Foul Play).

Time commitment

- to attend a monthly board meeting
 - dealing with infractions during the season can typically be about 10 - 15 hours a week
 - This timing is very sporadic depending on the type and number of red cards or citing that have occurred. When no discipline issues to deal with very little time is necessary.
 - In the offseason very little time commitment is needed.
